Report of the independent auditor on the summary financial statements to the Directors of North York Harvest Food Bank

The accompanying summary financial statements, which comprise the summary statements of financial position as at August 31, 2013 and August 31, 2012, the summary statements of opera-tions and changes in net assets and cash flows for the years then ended, and the related note, are derived from the audited financial statements of North York Harvest Food Bank for the years ended August 31, 2013 and August 31, 2012. We expressed a qualified audit opinion on those financial statements in our report dated January 30, 2014. Those financial statements, and the summary financial statements, do not reflect the effects of events that occurred subsequent to the date of our report on those financial statements.

The summary financial statements do not contain all the disclosures required by Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. Reading the summary financial statements, therefore, is not a substitute for reading the audited financial statements of North York Harvest Food Bank.

Management's responsibility for the summary financial statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of a summary of the audited financial statements on the basis described in the note to the summary financial statements.

Auditor's responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the summary financial statements based on our procedures, which were conducted in accordance with Canadian Auditing Standard (CAS) 810, "Engagements to Report on Summary Financial Statements".

In our opinion, these summary financial statements derived from the audited financial statements of North York Harvest Food Bank for the years ended August 31, 2013 and August 31, 2012 are a fair summary of those financial statements on the basis described in the note to the summary financial statements. However, the summary financial statements are potentially misstated as described in

our qualified audit opinion in our report dated January 30, 2014 on the financial statements of North York Harvest FoodBank for the years end August 31, 2013 and August 31, 2012. Our qualified audit opinion is based on the fact that in common with many charitable organizations, North York Harvest Food Bank derives revenues from donations and community events, the completeness of which is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of North York Harvest Food Bank. Therefore, we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to donations and community events, excess of revenues over expenditures and cash flows from operations for the years ended August 31, 2013 and August 31, 2012, current assets as at August 31, 2013 and August 31, 2012 and net assets at both the beginning and end of the years ended August 31, 2013 and August 31, 2012. Our qualified audit opinion states that, except for the possible effects of the described matter, those financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of North York Harvest Food Bank as at August 31, 2013 and August 31, 2012 and its results of operations and its cash flows for the years then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for profit organizations.


