The Links Between Us

Strength and resilience are the words Casey Ramsaran uses to describe North York Harvest. As the Chair of the Human Resources Committee, Casey sees the way the organization, especially the way the Executive Director, cares and supports each and every employee.

Casey has always known she wanted to sit on a Board and give back to the community. She was very deliberate in her choice of which Board, wanting it to align with her thoughts on the community and diversity. "Because now, I have the ability to serve on a Board with something that makes sense to me from a food perspective, from a diversity perspective, and from a community perspective." She took up the role of HR Chair since 2019.

"The way North York Harvest is very intentional about how the organization supports its employees is something that I really admire." Casey believes that HR at North York Harvest has always been about looking after the employees that are there to help serve the community. to ensure there are guidelines in place that work in compliance as well as sets the tone in providing clear information that is relevant and important for employees.

know it's going to be impactful." To Casey, it is the strength and resilience of everyone at North York Harvest that helped weather these few years. She talks about how she saw the passion and the resilience, the drive and the fight to provide support to the community in everyone at North York Harvest. She laughs as she brings up an old story of the former North York Harvest board chair commuting to the GTA from Hamilton, dressed as a radish, to bring the awareness of food insecurity to the forefront of the population. It is people with this kind of courage that makes North York Harvest the way it is. To end, she wants to applaud every employee at North York Harvest, and thank them for all their hard work and efforts.
