The Hub enables us to accept surplus food from farmers, manufacturers, and distributors, saving good food from waste and getting it to people who need it most.



FOOD DISTRIBUTION

With greater efficiency, the Hub delivers to food banks, schools, student nutrition programs, shelters, drop-ins, and community kitchens reaching thousands of people in our community every single day.
